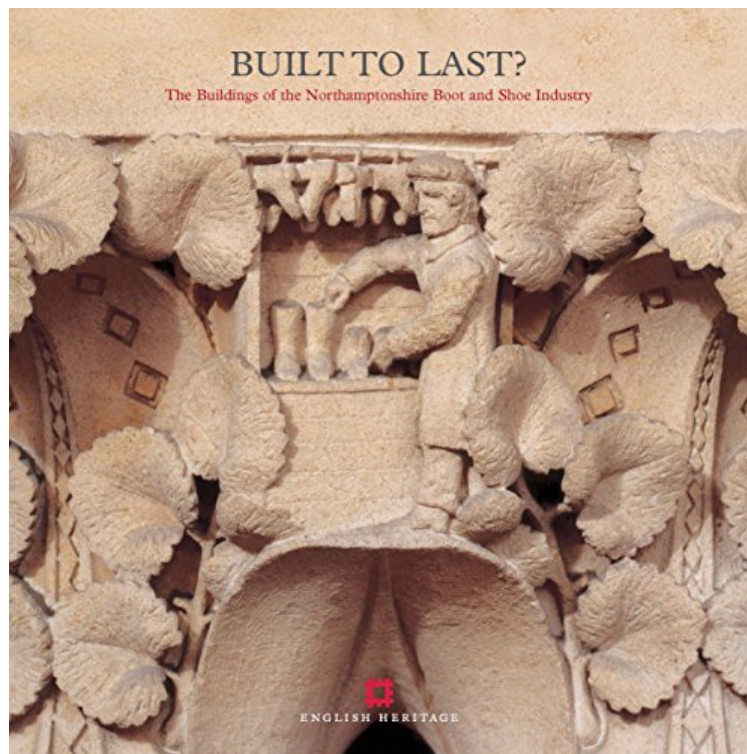


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Built to Last?: The buildings of the Northamptonshire boot and shoe industry (Informed Conservation)
