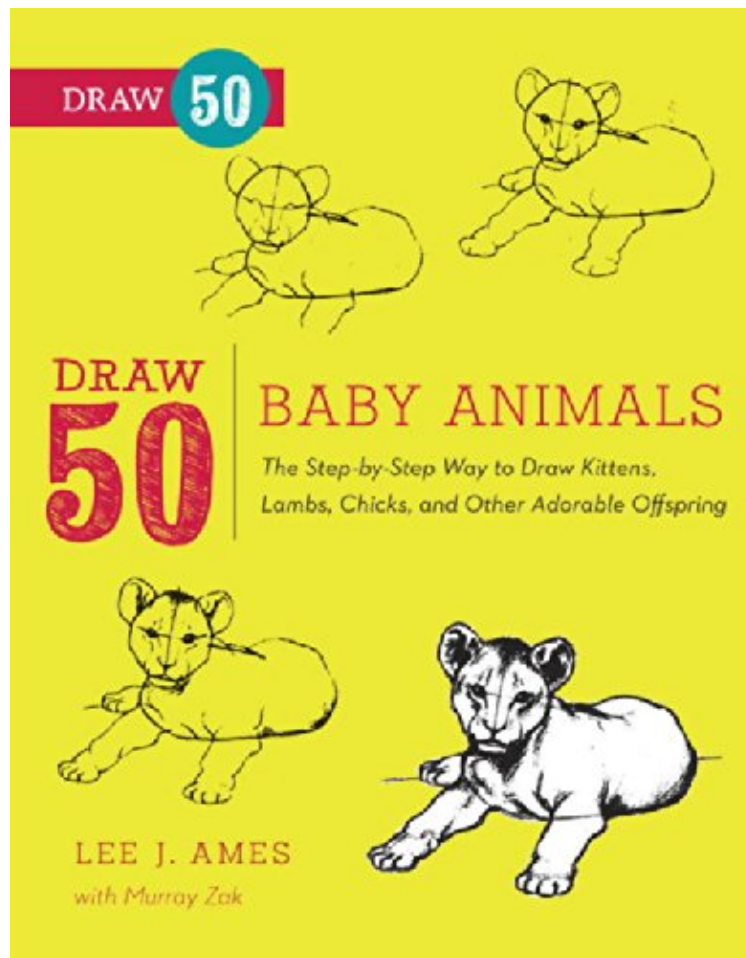

It's has really nice designs, with progressive steps to start with leading through 6-8 steps to the final one. The one thing I wish was that it had an age range or skill recommendation as it might be frustrating for someone who has minimal drawing experience. The final images are well shaded and detailed, which can be complex for younger kids, but overall I think it does a good job in teaching structural steps to creating an image. As the book recommends, I'll definitely have to go out and get quality drafting paper, pencils, and erasers, as well as encourage her to not be frustrated if not mimicking the authors final images.
