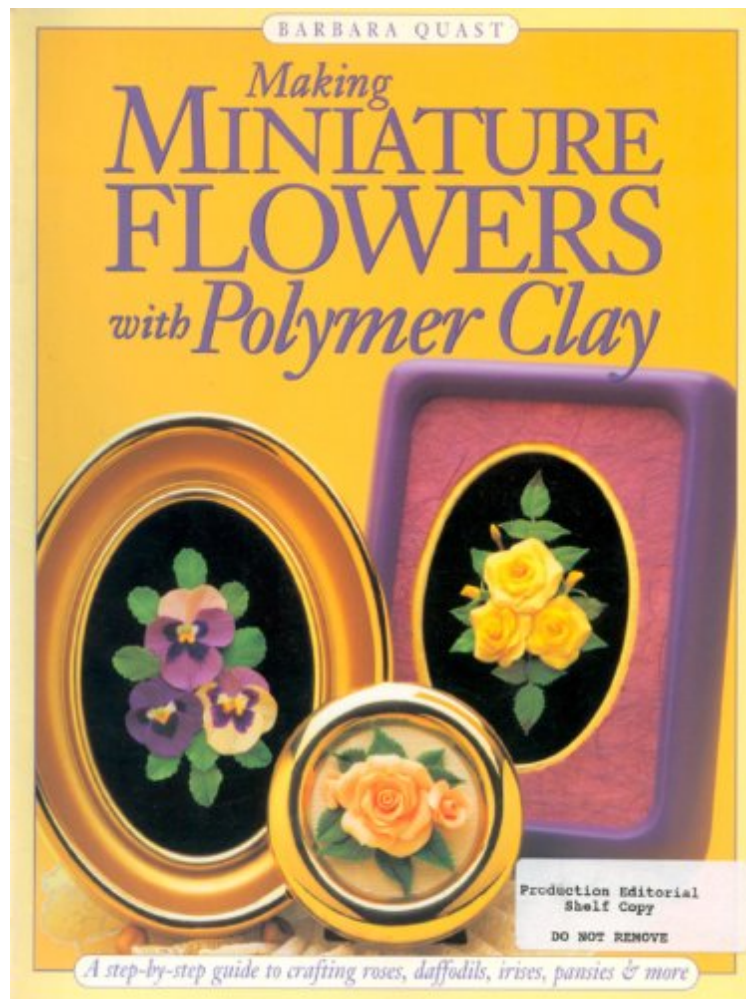

They are so incredibly small that the hand holding the work in each photo is about the size of an 18" doll's! Since the clay flower parts are even smaller, I had to use a strong magnifying glass to see them! For example, the photo for the leaf for the rose, the leaf in the photo is about 1/4" big!! And we're supposed to use it as a construction example? Good golly!!
