In a lot of the book it's obvious that the art was done by different people; that may be a plus or a minus as you can see a few of the different ways to draw manga. The book is really lacking in terms of how to draw heads. Mark Crilley's Mastering Manga does an insanely better job at it. One issue I ave with this book is that it shows you how to DRAW manga, but it seriously lacks on how to write it, unlike Impact Studio's obscure book-that-I-can't-remember-the-name-of. Overall, though, I'd definitely recommend it. Also, it struggles in terms of proportions and how many heads tall people are.
