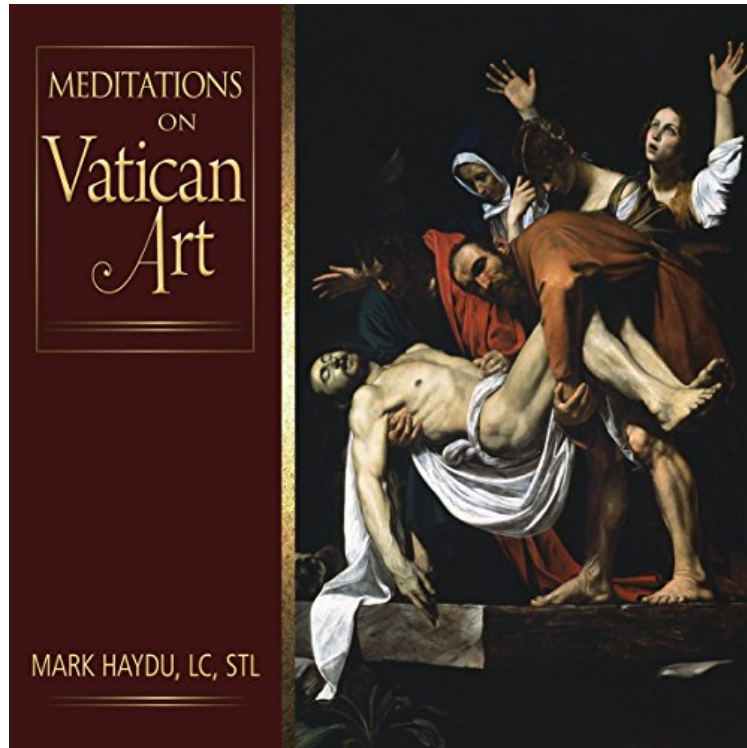

It is a large coffee-table sized book with all color pictures and detailed meditations that follow the format of the Ignatius Spiritual Exercises. Note that the book is not attempting to catalog all Vatican art (there are hundreds of thousands of pieces). Instead, the author is choosing specific pieces of sacred art that follow a theme of events of salvation history and the beauty (and/or glory) of these events for followers of the faith.This would be a great gift for any Christian and especially Catholic Christian who wants to meditate on the sweep of salvation history that culminates in the Resurrection, and the Hope (and, yes, the responsibilities) that this event signals.Highly recommended.3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. Together these meditations add up to an Ignatius retreat that I have found to be quite inspiring and uplifting.
